Chapter D: To enhance the game of golf and the golf course management profession by providing education, advocacy and recognition for the professionals in the industry.

Chapter E: To enhance communications between local chapters; to form a strong voting block to promote national director candidates; to organize and monitor the state trophy golf tournament; to track legislation in order to protect the best interests of all state superintendents; to enhance the image of golf course superintendents locally and nationally.

Chapter F: To represent the golf course management profession both locally and nationally; to meet the development needs of the membership through education, research and other technologies; to become the resource for employment opportunities; to recognize and promote key golf course management positions throughout the industry.

Chapter G: To provide for and enhance the recognition of the golf course superintendent as a professional; to provide its members with the best possible educational programs; to create a closer fellowship among those engaged in the profession of golf course management.

Chapter H: To support and improve the golf course superintendents' profession by providing: educational opportunities; affording fellowship and networking; promoting the game of golf; endowing funds for scholarship and research; and communicating the positive impact golf has on the environment.

Chapter I: To serve its members; to advance the profession; and to enrich the quality of golf and the environment.

Chapter J: To provide for and enhance the recognition of the golf course superintendent and turf manager as professionals; to cooperate with and support the interests and purposes of GCSAA; to advance the art and science of greenkeeping; to collect and disseminate practical knowledge of golf course management and other related turfgrass fields with a view of fostering more efficient and economical management of golf courses and other related turfgrass facilities.

Chapter K: To provide its membership with education, a forum for communication and the enhancement of the image of its members; to support research involved with improving the golf course maintenance profession, its practices and management; to protect the environment while striving to improve playing conditions.

Chapter L: To promote professional improvement through the education and cooperation of its members; to advocate the golf course superintendent; and strive to demonstrate devotion to the industry, the environment, the game of golf and the community.

Chapter M: To unite the golf course superintendents of this area into one organization; to foster and maintain high standards of professional qualification and ethics; to encourage study, research, discussion and analysis of all matters which will aid in the improvement of golf courses; to affiliate and cooperate with other organizations for the mutual benefit of accomplishing similar or related objectives; to help members render assistance to other members for the betterment of their golf courses.

Chapter N: To promote: the welfare of the game of golf; the science and art of golf course management; the organization and business effectiveness of the profession; the professional image and well-being of its individual members through the timely and efficient use of present-day educational, communications and management means.

Chapter O: To provide its members the opportunity to excel professionally and enhance the game of golf through responsible turfgrass management.
